## The PRITIKIN TROPHY

In 1957, Melvin R. Spencer, a Del Rey Yacht Club member, presented to the club, a trophy in memory of a departed family member, Arnold Pritikin, even though Arnold had not been involved with Del Rey Yacht Club. The trophy was designated the "Arnold Pritikin Perpetual Trophy," and the original winner in 1957 was Wesly E. Nance. The name of the yacht club of each winner was not added to the plaques to be attached to the trophy until 1995 when the winner was Mel Lurie from Del Rey Yacht Club.

## REOPENING TASK FORCE UPDATE THURSDAY, MAY 26, 2022

#### Here's What You Need to Know:

- We need 100 percent compliance with these Club requirements.
- Please get a free COVID-19 test if you have symptoms, stay home if you are sick, and take extra precautions if you have underlying conditions.

NOTE: If you contract COVID-19, we would appreciate it if you would voluntarily let us know. Please contact DRYC's Jr. Staff Commodore Bernie Glasser, who is a medical doctor. This will allow us to Contact Trace to help reduce the virus' spread at DRYC.

To Enter the Clubhouse, Members / Guests Must Be Fully Vaccinated & Show Proof of Vaccination

- Full vaccination includes taking the booster shots, once eligible.
- Until being fully vaccinated, children must continue getting tested. This applies to children entering the Clubhouse or participating in DRYC's Jr. Sailing Program.
- Members are not permitted inside the Clubhouse if symptomatic.
- Members may return to the Club 10 days after testing positive for COVID.
- Members may return to the Club if asymptomatic as long as they are wearing N95 or KN95 face masks.

NOTE: Grievances may be filed against members who do not adhere to these mandates.

In the Corinthian spirit, we ask all Club members to remind each other to put on masks inside the Clubhouse for the health and protection of our membership.

#### **RALLY RULES**

- A. Races shall be calculated with a start time of 0830 hours for the PRITIKIN. However, actual start times will be assigned as set forth in Special Rules A.
- B. Skippers will monitor VHF channel 16: Race communications will be on VHF Channel 71.
- C. Contest prepared using Chart: 18744 33rd Ed., 08/01/2010 updated as provided in Coastal Explorer and the latest amended SCCA racing rules.
- D. The races will be scored with no handicap.
- E. This contest allows an open log where during the rally the skipper may view all times that are recorded on the actual Log.
- F. Skippers may use all equipment aboard the vessel including GPS, speed, chart plotters, etc., except clock time, elapsed time or ETA from any source.

#### **SPECIAL RULES**

- A. Each skipper must notify Mickey Scheinbaum @ 323-428-0304 by Monday; June 20th, that they are an entrant and disclose their racing speed in order that start times can be assigned at the skippers' meeting on Friday, June 24, 2022.
- B. Each Skipper must provide their own Observer.
- C. Committee boat: THREE FLAGS
- D. Following the PEEL-OFF and awards for Friday's SCCA Rally, there will be an informal skippers' meeting for the PRITIKIN Rally.
- E. Predicted logs are to be turned in to the committee at or before the skippers' meeting. Actual Logs with the skipper's clock to be turned in to the scorer at DRYC as soon as possible after the contest, but no later than 1330 hours.
- F. For slip assignments please email the attached Slip Request From to DRYC first come first serve so the SOONER THE BETTER.
