## **Cruiser Navigation Rally**

March 3, 2018



This rally kicks off the season in SCCA cruiser navigation rallies. Held in the relatively sheltered waters of the San Pedro Bay and Channel, it provides the year's first opportunity for power cruiser skippers to check out their vessels and refresh their skills at this exciting navigational challenge. Long Beach Yacht Club invites all members of Southern California Cruiser Association Yacht Clubs to participate in this Cruiser Navigation Rally, previously known as a predicted log contest.

### **EVOLUTION OF THE "SEASON OPENER"**

In 1947, a group of Cruiser Navigation skippers who had been competing under the Southern California Yachting Association (SCYA) met at Ciro's restaurant on Santa Monica Boulevard and organized the Southern California Cruiser Association (SCCA). The intent was to create a separate organization whose primary emphasis was on power cruiser Cruiser Navigation rallies rather than sailboat racing. King Brugman of Long Beach YC was named as the first Commodore and the newly formed SCCA sanctioned a handful of rallies each year.

The two Cruiser Navigation rallies that had been run during the SCYA's Midwinter and Midsummer Regattas remained with SCYA. They were the Brittain and the Donaldson contests, respectively. Later the Midsummer was dropped and the Donaldson trophy was moved to the Midwinter as the Class B trophy. The host club for the Midwinter log rally alternated yearly between California and Long Beach Yacht Clubs. The entry fee for sailboats in the Midwinter ranged from a couple of bucks for the smallest class of sailboats to a very substantial fee for the largest seventy-plus foot sailboats. In the mid seventies discontent arose when the entry fee for all the predicted loggers was set at the maximum charged for the largest sailboats.

After meetings between the SCYA and the SCCA failed to produce an acceptable resolution to the problem, SCCA withdrew from further participation in the SCYA Midwinter. A replacement rally needed to be created to fill the void in the schedule - LBYC fleet captain Arnold Cowan proposed the Season Opener. Upon approval, he created the present trophy.

Interestingly, after the split, the Donaldson Trophy was retained by the SCCA and is now used for the Long Beach to San Diego skippers, which is elemental to the LBYC Craig Rally.

The Season Opener Rally typically runs in the sheltered waters of the San Pedro Bay and is a relatively short course that can easily be navigated on a Saturday morning. Skippers usually tie up after the rally at the LBYC Long Dock for some enjoyable camaraderie. The Awards banquet Saturday evening is a favorite as skippers and crew get together to discuss the contest and catch up on happenings since last year's Season Closer. The LBYC Season Opener remains as one of the most popular of the SCCA rallies.

#### **SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Easy-Entry skippers may enter without submitting a predicted log see attached.
- 2. This rally will use a staggered start with the fastest vessel starting first and the slowest last. All vessels shall submit a predicted log showing a 0900 starting time. Staggered starting times will be assigned at the skippers meeting.
- 3. Chart used to prepare rally course: 18749, 44<sup>th</sup> edition. Official distance: 15.1 nm.
- 4. Rally communications: use VHF channel 71
- 5. Skipper may call mark at waypoints. If called, Observer shall record time on back of Actual Log.
- 6. Rally will be scored without handicap.
- 7. All equipment aboard the vessel may be used except that which is prohibited. Use of clock time in any form is prohibited.
- 8. Use of GPS is permitted including speed. No time information such as ETA, ETE, TTG, etc. may be displayed. Cover any prohibited data display with opaque tape.
- **9**. A chart plotter may be used to display an electronic chart. The vessel's location may be displayed. No time (present, TTG, ETA, etc.) shall be displayed.
- 10. This is an Open Log rally. Skipper may view the Actual Log during the rally.

### March 3 2018, LBYC Season Opener Rally - Easy Entry

A special feature of the LBYC Season Opener Cruiser Navigation Rally is the provision for Easy-Entry rally skippers to participate without the need to run a measured mile or to prepare and submit a predicted log. The course is just sixteen-miles and it's all inside the Long Beach breakwater so you'll be running in sheltered water.

It's simple! All you need to do is attend the March 2 - Friday night LBYC Skipper's Meeting at 6:30 pm to give the Committee your intended speed, normal cruise speed is usually best, and have a starting time assigned. Any questions you have will be answered and they'll even provide an observer if you need one. Saturday morning you'll go to the East Jetty of the marina entrance and start at your assigned time. Then follow the course instructions to navigate past the control points. Simply run the course at your stated speed as your observer records the time on the Actual Log when you pass the control points. You can use the speed readout on your GPS to adjust your throttle to maintain the speed you've choosen to run.

After your Log is turned in, the Committee will use the speed you choose to prepare a prediction for your boat. Then they'll compare that prediction with your actual times to figure your score.

It's that easy - Come on out and join in the fun!
